**Varsity races will be balanced. We will use the most recent milesplit rankings to create even races.*

***Novice races are for athletes who may not yet be ready for the SM Championship 5K course. Anyone may run in the Novice race. You do not need a team in Varsity in order to run in Novice.*

****Meet management and officials will establish a cut-off time for athletes reentering the moat at 2.5 miles. This is to ensure that there are no collisions in the moat.*

Individual Awards: T-shirt to top 20 finishers in all races

Special Trophies: Fastest overall 5K time of the day and fastest overall 5th runner of the day

Team Awards: Trophies to top 3 teams in Varsity races, top team in JV, frosh, and novice races.

Plaques to best 5-person average for large schools (Class A-815 and up) and small schools (combined classes BCD-814 and under).

Entry Fee(s):

\$75.00 per team (1-7 runners)

\$10.00 per individual after full team fee is paid

\$200 blanket fee for Section XI teams

\$300 blanket per gender for schools outside Section XI teams

Purpose of Form

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

- Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)

- Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
- Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
- Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
- Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
- Form 1099-K (merchant card and third party network transactions)
- Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
- Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
- Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN.

If you do not return Form W-9 to the requester with a TIN, you might be subject to backup withholding. See What is backup withholding, later.
